**The Pensions Appeal Tribunals (Scotland) (Amendment)
Rules 1967**

I, James Latham Clyde, Lord President of the Court of Session, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by paragraph 5(4) of the Schedule to, as read along with section 13 of, the Pensions Appeal Tribunals Act 1943(a), and after consultation with the Council on Tribunals in accordance with section 8 of the Tribunals and Inquiries Act 1958(b), hereby make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Pensions Appeal Tribunals (Scotland) (Amendment) Rules 1967 and shall come into operation on 20th January 1967.

2. The Pensions Appeal Tribunals (Scotland) Rules 1946(c) as amended (d) shall be further amended as follows:—

In Rule 26(3) (which relates to the expenses allowable to appellants and their attendants), for the words “fifty shillings” there shall be substituted “65s.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Rules.)

These Rules further amend the Pensions Appeal Tribunals (Scotland) Rules 1946, by increasing from 50s. to 65s. the maximum allowance payable to an appellant or his representative or attendant for loss of time.
