The Indian Military Service Family Pension Fund (Amendment) Rules 1967

Made - - - - 31st March 1967

The Minister of Overseas Development, in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Secretary of State by sub-section (1) of section 273 of the Government of India Act 1935(a) and paragraph 14(1) of the Government of India (Family Pension Funds) Order 1936(b), and vested in him by virtue of the Transfer of Functions (Overseas Pensions) Order 1965(c), hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. The Indian Military Service Family Pension Fund Rules(d) as amended(e) are hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) In the footnotes to Rules 2, 8 and 18 and in the Third Schedule, for the words “Commonwealth Relations Office” shall be substituted the words “Ministry of Overseas Development”.

(2) For sub-rule (2) of Rule 34 the following shall be substituted:—

“(2) With effect from 1st January 1967, the amount of any supplementary pension contingent liability for which was accepted before the 1st April 1958 shall be subject to a temporary increase of 17½ per cent.”.

(3) For sub-rule (3) of Rule 34 the following shall be substituted:—

“(3) With effect from 1st January 1967, the amount of any supplementary pension contingent liability for which was accepted on or after 1st April 1958 and before 1st April 1962 shall be subject to a temporary increase of 12½ per cent.”.

(4) After sub-rule (3) of Rule 34 there shall be inserted the following sub-rule:—

“(4) With effect from 1st January 1967, the amount of any supplementary pension contingent liability for which was accepted on or after 1st April 1962 and before 1st April 1966 shall be subject to a temporary increase of 7½ per cent.”.

(5) The Schedule to these Rules shall be substituted for the Seventh Schedule to the said Rules.

2. These Rules may be cited as the Indian Military Service Family Pension Fund (Amendment) Rules 1967.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Rules.)

These Rules provide for an increase, as from 1st January 1967, on a temporary basis, in the rates of pension payable under the Rules of the Indian Military Service Family Pension Fund.

The Rules also substitute references to the Ministry of Overseas Development for references to the Commonwealth Relations Office in the original Rules.

The unfettered powers of administration of this Fund conferred on the Secretary of State which have now devolved upon the Minister of Overseas Development enable him to make Rules with retrospective effect.
