**The Registration (Births, Still-births, Deaths and Marriages)
Amendment Regulations 1968**

<i>Made</i>	- - -	1st August 1968
<i>Coming into Operation</i>		1st October 1968

The Registrar General, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 11(3), 14(3), 24(2) and (4) and 39 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act 1953(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, with the approval of the Minister of Health, hereby makes the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Registration (Births, Still-births, Deaths and Marriages) Amendment Regulations 1968 and shall come into operation on 1st October 1968.
2. The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. The following provisions in the Registration (Births, Still-births, Deaths and Marriages) Consolidated Regulations 1954(c) as amended (d) are hereby revoked, namely—
 - (a) regulation 49 (which prescribes a fee for re-registration of the birth of a legitimated person more than 3 months after legitimation);
 - (b) paragraph (3) of regulation 67 (which prescribes a fee for a duplicate certificate as to registration of a still-birth);
 - (c) regulation 89 (which prescribes a fee for a certificate that a death is not required to be registered);
 - (d) regulation 93 (which prescribes a fee for a duplicate certificate as to registration of a death).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations revoke provisions in the Registration (Births, Still-births, Deaths and Marriages) Consolidated Regulations 1954 which prescribe certain fees. The fees relate to re-registration of the birth of a legitimated person, duplicate certificates as to registration of a still-birth or death, and certificates that a death is not required to be registered.
