**BETTING AND GAMING**

**The Gaming Clubs (Licensing) Regulations 1969**

<i>Made</i>	- - -	<i>31st July 1969</i>
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>		<i>11th August 1969</i>
<i>Coming into Operation</i>		<i>1st October 1969</i>

In pursuance of sections 22(3) and 51 of the Gaming Act 1968(a), and after consultation with the Gaming Board for Great Britain, I hereby make the following Regulations :—

PART I

*Introductory*

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Gaming Clubs (Licensing) Regulations 1969 and shall come into operation on 1st October 1969.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) applies for the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- (3) In these Regulations, “the Act” means the Gaming Act 1968.
- (4) These Regulations shall not extend to Scotland.

PART II

*Grounds of refusal of licence additional to those in Schedule 2 to the Act*

2. This Part of these Regulations does not apply to licences to be granted or renewed subject to restrictions imposed under paragraph 25(1) of Schedule 2 to the Act limiting gaming (to which Part II of the Act applies) to bingo, bridge or whist or to both bridge and whist but, subject to that, it applies to all licences under the Act proposed to be granted or renewed.

3. A licensing authority shall refuse to grant or renew a licence to which this Part of these Regulations applies where the licence is to be in respect of premises situated, wholly or in part, outside the areas specified in Schedule 1 to these Regulations.

4.—(1) A licensing authority may refuse to grant or renew a licence to which this Part of these Regulations applies where the licence is to be in respect of premises to which a person might, otherwise than in an emergency, gain access directly from private premises not to be included in the licence.

(2) In this Regulation, a reference to premises includes a reference to any part of any premises, and in particular to any courtyard, lobby, passage or

stairway ; and the reference to private premises includes a reference to any premises to which the public have access (whether on payment or otherwise) only by permission of the owner, lessee or occupier.

*Restrictions to be imposed in licences*

5. A licensing authority shall, in the case of a licence to which this Part of these Regulations applies, impose a restriction under paragraph 25(1) of Schedule 2 to the Act limiting gaming (to which Part II of the Act applies) to the playing of games other than bingo.

6. A licensing authority shall, in the case of a licence to which this Part of these Regulations applies, impose a restriction under paragraph 25(2) of Schedule 2 to the Act limiting the purposes for which the relevant premises may at any time be used to purposes other than dancing and the provision of music or entertainment by persons actually present and performing.

PART III

*Forms and other administrative matters*

7.—(1) An application for the grant, renewal, transfer or cancellation of a licence under the Act shall be made in writing, in the appropriate form set out in Schedule 2 to these Regulations, by lodging the application with the clerk to the licensing authority for the petty sessions area in which the relevant premises are situated.

(2) A licence under the Act, as granted or renewed, shall be in the appropriate form set out in Schedule 3 to these Regulations.

(3) The register to be kept under paragraph 1 of Schedule 10 to the Act shall be in the form set out in Schedule 4 to these Regulations.

(4) The prescribed fee for the purposes of paragraph 3 of Schedule 10 to the Act shall be five shillings.

(5) A reference in this Regulation to a form includes a reference to a form to the like effect with any variation which the circumstances may require.

8. The particulars to be sent to the Board by the clerk to a licensing authority under paragraph 5(1) of Schedule 10 to the Act in relation to the grant, renewal, transfer or cancellation of a licence under the Act shall be as follows :—

- (a) the name of the club ;
- (b) the address of the relevant premises ;
- (c) the name of the licensee or, in the case of a transfer, of the old and new licensees ;
- (d) a statement or indication of any restriction under paragraph 25 of Schedule 2 to the Act as to the kinds of games which may be played ;
- (e) in the case of cancellation, a brief statement of the grounds or, in the case of cancellation on relinquishment under paragraph 65 of Schedule 2 to the Act, an indication of that fact.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)*

These Regulations relate to the licensing of club premises in England and Wales for the purposes of the Gaming Act 1968.

Regulation 3 prevents licences from being granted in respect of premises outside the areas specified in Schedule 1 to the Regulations, except for the purposes of bingo or bridge and whist.

Regulation 4 enables the licensing authority to refuse a licence (not restricted to bingo or bridge and whist) where there is direct access to the premises from other private premises not included in the licence.

Regulation 5 prevents a licence from being granted for both bingo and other gaming.

Regulation 6 prevents premises licensed for gaming, other than bingo, bridge and whist, from being used for dancing or for music or entertainments by persons actually present and performing.

The remaining provisions of the Regulations relate to the forms to be used and other administrative matters. The Regulations come into operation on 1st October 1969, in anticipation of the coming into force on 1st July 1970 of the substantive provisions of the Act relating to premises licensed for gaming.
