PENSIONS

The Superannuation (Transfers between the Civil Service and Public Boards) (Amendment) Rules 1969

24th September 1969 Made 30th September 1969 Laid before Parliament 1st October 1969 Coming into Operation

The Minister for the Civil Service, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 2 and 15 of the Superannuation (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1948(a) and article 2(1)(c) of the Minister for the Civil Service Order 1968(b), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Superannuation (Transfers between the Civil Service and Public Boards) (Amendment) Rules 1969, and shall come into operation on 1st October 1969.
- 2. The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the interpretation of these Rules as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. The Superannuation (Transfers between the Civil Service and Public Boards) Rules 1950(d) (hereafter in these Rules referred to as "the principal Rules"), as amended (e), shall have effect as if the following bodies were added to the Schedule thereto, that is to say:-

The Chemical and Allied Products Industry Training Board.

The Civil Air Transport Industry Training Board.

The Distributive Industry Training Board.

The Food, Drink and Tobacco Industry Training Board.

The Footwear, Leather and Fur Skin Industry Training Board.

The Paper and Paper Products Industry Training Board.

The Petroleum Industry Training Board.

The Printing and Publishing Industry Training Board.

The Rubber and Plastics Processing Industry Training Board.

The Meat and Livestock Commission.

The Post Office.

4. In their application to any person who becomes employed as a civil servant after ceasing to be in the pensionable employment of one of the bodies mentioned in the last preceding Rule the principal Rules shall have effect as if :---

- (a) the references to the date of the making of the principal Rules in Rule 3(1)(d) and (e) thereof were references to the date of the making of these Rules: and
- (b) the references to the coming into operation of the principal Rules in Rule 3(2) thereof were references to the coming into operation of these Rules.
- 5. In their application to any person who enters the pensionable employment of one of the bodies mentioned in Rule 3 of these Rules after ceasing to be employed as a civil servant the principal Rules shall have effect as if:—
 - (a) the reference to the date of the making of the principal Rules in Rule 7(1)(e) thereof were a reference to the date of the making of these Rules: and
 - (b) the references to the coming into operation of the principal Rules in Rule 7(2) thereof were references to the coming into operation of these Rules.

EXPLANATORY NOTE (This Note is not part of the Rules.)

These Rules add certain Industrial Training Boards, the Meat and Livestock Commission and the Post Office to the Schedule to the Superannuation (Transfers between the Civil Service and Public Boards) Rules 1950. The principal Rules provide for the aggregation of service and for a single superannuation award in cases where a person transfers from pensionable service with one of the bodies specified to an established post in the Civil Service or vice versa.

Under the powers of section 2(5) of the Superannuation (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1948, the Rules apply, subject to certain conditions, to persons who have transferred from one employment to the other before the coming into operation of the Rules.
