CLEAN AIR**The Smoke Control Areas (Authorised Fuels) (Scotland) Regulations 1969.**

Made - - - - - 19th December 1969
Laid before Parliament 30th December 1969
Coming into Operation 31st December 1969

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 34(1) of the Clean Air Act 1956(a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following regulations :—

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Smoke Control Areas (Authorised Fuels) (Scotland) Regulations 1969 and shall come into operation on 31st December 1969.

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Authorised fuels for the purposes of the Clean Air Act 1956

3. In Scotland the following fuel is hereby declared to be an authorised fuel for the purposes of the Clean Air Act 1956 :—

“Rexco Briquettes” manufactured by Scottish Rexco Limited having Rexco breeze as a main constituent which has been subjected to a heating process.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

Section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956 makes it an offence to emit smoke from a chimney of a building within a smoke control area unless it can be shown that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. These regulations declare the fuel mentioned in regulation 3 to be an authorised fuel for the purposes of the Act in Scotland.
