**The Air Navigation (General) (Second Amendment)
Regulations 1969**

Made - - - 22nd April 1969

Coming into Operation 1st May 1969

The Board of Trade, in exercise of their powers under Articles 7(3) and 8(4) of the Air Navigation Order 1966(a), as amended(b), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (General) (Second Amendment) Regulations 1969, and shall come into operation on 1st May 1969.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(c) applies for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The Air Navigation (General) Regulations 1966(d), as amended(e), shall be further amended as follows:—

(1) In Regulation 11 in the list of prescribed countries:

(a) After “Dominica” there shall be inserted “Ghana”;

(b) After “Kenya” there shall be inserted “Kuwait”;

(c) After “St. Vincent” there shall be inserted “Singapore”;

(d) “Southern Rhodesia” shall be deleted;

(e) For “United Republic of Tanzania and Zanzibar” there shall be substituted “United Republic of Tanzania”;

(2) In the first sentence of the Schedule, for “(9)” there shall be substituted “(10)”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Air Navigation (General) Regulations 1966, as previously amended.

In addition to correcting two minor errors, these Regulations add Ghana, Kuwait and Singapore to, and delete Southern Rhodesia from, the list of countries prescribed by Regulation 11 whose licensed maintenance engineers may issue certificates of maintenance and compliance for the purposes of the Air Navigation Order 1966.
