The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 9) Order 1970

Made - - - 2nd October 1970 Laid before the House of

Commons - - - 5th October 1970 Coming into Operation - 7th October 1970

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by sections 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, on the recommendation of the Board of Trade hereby make the following Order:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 9) Order 1970.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the Interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
 - (3) This Order shall come into operation on 7th October 1970.
- 2.—(1) Until the beginning of 5th November 1970, any import duty which is for the time being chargeable on goods of heading 73.13 of the Customs Tariff 1959 shall not be chargeable in respect of cold reduced sheets and plates of iron or steel, rectangular or in coils, of a width exceeding 500 millimetres, and of a thickness of less than 3 millimetres, not plated, coated, clad, drilled, punched or otherwise worked.
- (2) For the purposes of classification under the Customs Tariff 1959, in so far as that depends on the rate of duty, any goods to which paragraph (1) above applies shall be treated as chargeable with the same duty as if this Order had not been made.
