The Banking Companies (Accounts) Regulations 1970

Laid before Parliament in draft

Made - - 26th February 1970

Coming into Operation 1st April 1970

Whereas a draft of these Regulations has been approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by section 454(1) of the Companies Act 1948(a) and section 12 of the Companies Act 1967(b) hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Banking Companies (Accounts) Regulations 1970 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1970.
- 2. These Regulations apply to any banking company which is for the time being one of the London Clearing Banks or which is for the time being represented on the Committee of Scottish Bank General Managers.
- 3. Paragraph 23 of Schedule 8 to the Companies Act 1948 is hereby repealed with respect to banking companies to which these Regulations apply.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations, which apply only to the banking companies described in Regulation 2, amend the requirements of the Companies Acts as to the particulars to be disclosed in company accounts. The banks concerned will no longer be exempted from any of these requirements.
