# WAGES COUNCILS

# The Wages Regulation (Retail Food) (Scotland) (Amendment) Order 1970

Made - - - 4th June 1970 Coming into Operation 13th July 1970

Whereas the Secretary of State has received from the Retail Food Trade: Wages Council (Scotland) the wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto;

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State in exercise of her powers under section 11 of the Wages Councils Act 1959(a), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Wages Regulation (Retail Food) (Scotland (Amendment) Order 1970.
- 2.—(1) In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 13th July 1970, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the nex such period following that date.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto shall have effect as from the specified date.

Article 3

#### **SCHEDULE**

The Wages Regulation (Retail Food) (Scotland) Order 1970(a) (Order R.F.C.S. (41)) shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto:—

- 1. for paragraphs 4 and 5 there were substituted the following paragraphs:—
  "WORKERS OTHER THAN SHOP MANAGERS, SHOP MANAGERESSES, TEMPORARY SHOP MANAGERS, TEMPORARY SHOP MANAGERESSES, CENTRAL TRANSPORT WORKERS AND RETAIL TRANSPORT WORKERS
- 4. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 1, the minimum remuneration payable to male or female workers of the classes specified in Column 1 of the following table employed in Area 1 or Area 2, as the case may be, shall be the appropriate amount set out in Column 2:—

2. in paragraph 21 for the definition of "Customary Holiday" there were substituted the following:—

# "'CUSTOMARY HOLIDAY' means—

1st and 2nd January (or, if either of these days fall on a Sunday, 3rd January shall be substituted for such day);

the local Spring holiday;

the local Autumn holiday;

Christmas Day (or, if Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, 26th December shall be substituted); and

two other days, observed by local custom as holidays, to be fixed by the employer and notified to the worker; and any day proclaimed as a public holiday throughout Scotland."

# **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order, which has effect from 13th July 1970, amends the Wages Regulation (Retail Food) (Scotland) Order 1970 (Order R.F.C.S. (41)) by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration for workers aged 21 years or below fixed by that Order and providing for an additional day of customary holiday.
