**The National Health Service (Southampton University Hospital
Designation) Order 1970**

The Secretary of State for Social Services, being satisfied that the group of hospitals specified in Schedule 1 to this order and vested in him provides for the University of Southampton facilities for undergraduate and post-graduate clinical teaching and after consultation with that University, in exercise of his powers under section 5 of the Health Services and Public Health Act 1968(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the National Health Service (Southampton University Hospital Designation) Order 1970 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1971.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) applies to the interpretation of this order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The group of hospitals specified in Schedule 1 to this order (hereinafter in this order referred to as “the group”) is hereby designated as a university hospital.

3. Part II of Schedule 3 to the National Health Service Act 1946(c) (constitution of Hospital Management Committees) shall have effect in relation to the Committee appointed to exercise functions with respect to the management and control of the group, as modified and set out in Schedule 2 to this order.

SCHEDULE 2

CONSTITUTION OF THE SOUTHAMPTON UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL
MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The provisions of Part II of Schedule 3 to the National Health Service Act 1946 shall have effect as modified and set out below:—

- (1) subject to the following provisions of this Schedule, the Hospital Management Committee shall consist of a Chairman, appointed by the Wessex Regional Hospital Board after consultation with the University of Southampton, and 15 other members appointed by the Board;
- (2) of the 15 other members 3 shall be nominated by the University of Southampton but of these 3 not more than 2 shall be medical practitioners or dental practitioners, and 3 shall be nominated by the medical and dental staff of the group after consultation with the Wessex Regional Hospital Board and the University of Southampton;
- (3) other members shall include persons appointed after consultation with:—
 - (i) any local health authority whose area comprises the area or any part of the area served by the group; and
 - (ii) any Executive Council whose area comprises the area or any part of the area served by the group; and
 - (iii) the senior medical and dental staff of the group; and
 - (iv) such other organisations as appear to the Board to be concerned;
- (4) not more than 6 members shall be medical practitioners or dental practitioners;
- (5) before making appointments to fill vacancies, the Board shall consult the Committee.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Order designates the group of hospitals set out in Schedule 1 as a university hospital, associated with the University of Southampton, and provides for a modified form of Hospital Management Committee (as set out in Schedule 2) to manage and control it.
