INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNALS

The Industrial Tribunals (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1971

Made - - - 11th October 1971

Laid before Parliament 20th October 1971

Coming into Operation 25th October 1971

The Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 12 of the Industrial Training Act 1964(a) and by section 46 of the Redundancy Payments Act 1965(b) and after consultation with the Council on Tribunals hereby makes the following Regulations amending the Industrial Tribunals (England and Wales) Regulations 1965(c), as amended (d), (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"):—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Industrial Tribunals (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1971 and shall come into operation on 25th October 1971.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(e) shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Amendment of principal Regulations

2. Paragraph (3) of Regulation 5 of the principal Regulations shall be further amended by deleting the words commencing with "as to one" to the end of the paragraph and by inserting after the words "by the President (or by a member of the panel of chairmen for the time being nominated by the President for the purpose)" the following words:

"from a panel of persons appearing to the Secretary of State to have knowledge or experience of employment in industry or commerce appointed by the Secretary of State after consultation with such organisations or associations of organisations representative of employers or of employed persons as the Secretary of State considers to be appropriate."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Industrial Tribunals (England and Wales) Regulations 1965, as previously amended, by providing that the members of a tribunal other than the chairman shall be persons appointed by the Secretary of State appearing to him to have knowledge or experience of employment in industry or commerce.
