## CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

**The Import Duties (General) (No. 10) Order 1971**

Made - - - - 16th December 1971

Laid before the  
House of Commons 17th December 1971

Coming into Operation 1st January 1972

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State hereby make the following Order:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (General) (No. 10) Order 1971.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) This Order shall come into operation on 1st January 1972.

2. In Schedule 1 to the Import Duties (General) (No. 7) Order 1971(c) (which by reference to the Customs Tariff 1959 sets out the import duties chargeable under the Import Duties Act 1958) for subheading (B) of heading 20.04 there shall be substituted the following subheading:—

“(B) Cherries; fruit peels:

(1) Drained or glacé cherries	...	10%	C	—
			E	10%
(2) Other	... ..	20%	C	—
			E	20%.”

3. In article 2 of the Import Duties (General) (No. 8) Order 1971(d) the words from “and the like amendment” onwards shall be omitted.
