The Supreme Court (Spring Holiday) Order 1972

Made - - - 28th June 1972

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 28th day of June 1972

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 53 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Consolidation) Act 1925(a), Her Majesty may from time to time by Order in Council, on a recommendation made, with the concurrence of the Lord Chancellor, by the Council of Judges of the Supreme Court assembled in pursuance of the provisions of Part X of that Act, make, revoke, or modify Orders regulating the vacations to be observed by the High Court and the Court of Appeal and in the offices of those Courts:

And whereas the said Council of Judges has recommended that the Whitsun Vacation should be replaced by the vacation specified in this Order:

And whereas the Lord Chancellor concurs in that recommendation:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Supreme Court (Spring Holiday) Order 1972.

2.—(1) Instead of the Whitsun Vacation heretofore observed there shall be observed by the High Court and the Court of Appeal and in the offices of those Courts a vacation beginning on the Saturday before and ending on the Monday after the spring holiday.

(2) In this article “the spring holiday” means the bank holiday falling on the last Monday in May or any day appointed instead of that day under section 1(2) of the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1971(b).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order substitutes for the Whitsun Vacation of the High Court and Court of Appeal a vacation of the same duration beginning on the Saturday before the last Monday in May (or any day substituted as a bank holiday) instead of on the Saturday before Whit Sunday.
