HORTICULTURAL GRANTS

Grants for Wholesale Markets (Extension of Period) Order 1972

Made - - - 8th June 1972

Laid before the House of Commons 16th June 1972

Coming into Operation 17th July 1972

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State, acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 10(6) of the Agriculture and Horticulture Act 1964(a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), with the approval of the Treasury, hereby make the following order:—

- 1. This order may be cited as the Grants for Wholesale Markets (Extension of Period) Order 1972, and shall come into operation on 17th July 1972.
- 2. The period mentioned in subsection (4) of section 10 of the Act (being the 10-year period, ending with 14th April 1974, after which no payment by way of grant under the section in connection with the provision, reconstruction or extension of markets of national importance for the sale by wholesale of horticultural produce shall be made, except in relation to such a market the provision, reconstruction or extension of which is completed before the end of that period) is hereby extended by a period of two years beginning with 15th April 1974.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This order extends by 2 years the 10-year period after which no payment of grant under section 10 of the Agriculture and Horticulture Act 1964 in connection with the provision, reconstruction or extension of markets of national importance for the sale by wholesale of horticultural produce shall be made, except in relation to such a market the provision, reconstruction or extension of which is completed before the end of the period. The period as so extended expires with 14th April 1976.

In accordance with section 10(6) of the Act, this order was approved by a resolution of the House of Commons on 30th June 1972.
