The Central Institutions (Scotland) Regulations 1974

Made - - - -	13th January 1974
Laid before Parliament	8th February 1974
Coming into Operation - for the purposes of Regulation 3	21st February 1974
for all other purposes	1st June 1974

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by sections 76(1) and 81(1) and (4) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962(a) as said section 81 is set out in section 15 of the Education (Scotland) Act 1969(b) and of section 144(1) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962 and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, and being of the opinion mentioned in regulation 9 of these regulations I hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation, construction and commencement

1.—(1) These regulations, which may be cited as the Central Institutions (Scotland) Regulations 1974, shall be construed as one with the Central Institutions (Scotland) Regulations 1972(c) and shall come into operation on 21st February 1974 for the purposes of regulation 3 and on 1st June 1974 for all other purposes.

(2) In these regulations any reference to any enactment or regulation or scheme shall be construed as a reference to that enactment or regulation or scheme as amended or extended by or under any other enactment or regulation or scheme or as contained in any other enactment or regulation or scheme substituted for that enactment or regulation or scheme.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Composition of governing bodies

2.—(1) The governing body of each of the central institutions specified in Column (1) of Schedule 1 to these regulations shall be composed of the governors *ex officio*, appointed governors and co-opted governors specified opposite that institution in Column (2) of that Schedule.

(2) Any governor *ex officio* specified in Column (2) of said Schedule 1 shall hold the office of such a governor for the duration of his tenure of the office by virtue of which he is such a governor.

(3) (a) Any appointed governor specified in Column (2) of said Schedule 1 shall, subject to the provisions of regulation 8(1) of these regulations, hold the office of such a governor for such a period, not exceeding four years, as is determined in relation to him by such a scheme as is specified in sub-paragraph (c) of this paragraph made by the governing body of which he is a member.

(b) The governing body of each of the central institutions specified in Column (1) of Schedule 1 to these regulations shall, after consultation with the full-time academic staff of the institution, make rules for the election of the governors to be elected by the full-time academic staff; provided that any rules made by the governing body under this paragraph may, after consultation with the full-time academic staff of the central institution, be revoked and replaced, or varied, by further rules made by that governing body under this paragraph.

(c) The governing body of each of the central institutions specified in Column (1) of said Schedule 1 shall, on or before 1st February 1976, make a scheme which shall—

- (i) determine the duration of the period of office (being a period not exceeding four years) of the appointed governors (other than governors to whom the provisions of regulation 8(1) of these regulations apply) specified opposite that institution in Column (2) of that Schedule;
- (ii) make provision for the retirement from office of the governors to whom the scheme applies, either at one time for all such governors or at different times for different such governors:

Provided that any scheme made by a governing body under this paragraph may be revoked and replaced, or varied, by a further scheme made by that governing body under this paragraph.

(4) Any co-opted governor specified in Column (2) of said Schedule 1 shall hold the office of such a governor for such a period, not exceeding four years from the date of the resolution by the governing body of which he is a member to co-opt him as may be determined by the governing body.

(5) Any appointed governor or co-opted governor specified in Column (2) of said Schedule 1 on the expiry of his period of office as such a governor shall, subject to the provisions of regulation 5 of these regulations, be eligible for re-appointment or co-option, as the case may be.

Notification of impending appointments

3. The governing body of each of the central institutions specified in Column (1) of Schedule 1 to these regulations shall, at least three months before the date on which any appointed governor specified opposite that institution in Column (2) of that Schedule requires to be appointed for the purposes of these regulations, notify the appointing body specified in relation to that appointed governor in said Column (2) of the impending appointment and of the said date and such appointing body shall as soon as practicable notify the said governing body of the person appointed by them as such a governor.

Casual vacancies

4. A governor of any of the central institutions specified in Column (1) of Schedule 1 to these regulations shall be deemed to have vacated his office as such a governor and the governing body of which he was a member shall declare his place vacant, in any of the following circumstances:—

- (a) where he intimates in writing to the governing body his resignation as such a governor;
- (b) where he has had his estate sequestrated or has made a trust deed for behoof of his creditors or a composition contract;
- (c) where he has become incapacitated by physical or mental illness from acting as such a governor;
- (d) where he has failed to attend any meetings of the governing body or any of its committees or sub-committees for a period longer than six consecutive months otherwise than for a reason approved by the governing body;
or
- (e) in the case of a governor whose appointment falls to be made either from among the members of the Academic Council or the full-time academic staff when he ceases to be a member of the Academic Council or the full-time academic staff as the case may be.

Disqualification of governors

5. Subject to the provisions of regulation 8(2) of these regulations a person who has attained the age of 70 years shall not thereafter be eligible to take office, whether for a first or subsequent term, as a governor of any of the central institutions specified in Column (1) of Schedule 1 to these regulations:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall prohibit a person who attains the said age during a term of office as a governor of such an institution from continuing as a governor thereof until the expiry of that term.

6. A person shall be disqualified from being a governor of any of the central institutions specified in Column (1) of Schedule 1 to these regulations, other than a governor *ex officio* or a governor appointed by the Academic Council or by the full-time academic staff, if he is a member of the full-time academic staff of the said central institution or if he is in receipt of full-time education being provided by the said central institution or if he, while pursuing a course of full-time education being provided by the said central institution, is allowed leave of absence from the course for a period.

Allowances

7. The governing body of any central institution specified in Column (1) of Schedule 1 to these regulations may pay to any of its members allowances in respect of—

- (a) expenses properly incurred in the performance of their duties,
- (b) loss of remunerative time, and
- (c) additional expenses (other than as aforesaid) necessarily incurred by them for the purpose of enabling them to perform their duties, being expenses to which they would not otherwise have been subject;

Provided that such allowances shall be at the same rates and on the same conditions as apply for the time being for similar allowances to members of local authorities in Scotland under the Local Government Act 1948(a) or sections 45(4) and 46 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973(b).

Transitional provisions

8.—(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of regulation 2(3)(a) of these regulations, the period of office of any person appointed as a governor specified in Column (2) of Schedule 1 to these regulations on or after 1st June 1974 and before 31st May 1976 shall not extend beyond 31st May 1976.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of regulation 5 of these regulations until 31st May 1976 said regulation 5 shall apply, in the case of existing governors, as if the reference therein to the age of 70 years was a reference to the age of 75 years.

(3) The governing body of any of the central institutions specified in Column (1) of Schedule 1 to these regulations in office prior to 1st June 1974 shall continue to exercise all the necessary acts of administration relative to the central institution and shall have all the powers necessary therefor until the first meeting of the governing body specified in regulation 2(1) of these regulations and they shall from and after the date of the said meeting wholly cease to exercise any right or power of administration over the said central institution.

Variations and revocations of instruments

9. The provisions of the enactments, schemes, articles of association and other instruments specified in Column (1) of Schedule 2 to these regulations are hereby varied or revoked (or both varied and revoked), as the case may be, to the extent (being the extent to which the provisions of such instruments are in the opinion of the Secretary of State inconsistent with these regulations) specified opposite such instruments in Column (2) of that Schedule.

Robert Gordon's Institute of Technology

10. Until such time as the City of Aberdeen Educational Endowments Scheme 1958 can be revised, the said Scheme shall be varied by the insertion after section 61 of the following section:—

“61A (1) The College Governors shall appoint a Standing Committee to be known as the Institute Committee which shall be constituted in accordance with the provisions of the following subsection and to which they shall delegate their functions insofar as these relate to the Robert Gordon's Institute of Technology (hereinafter referred to as “the Institute”).

(2) The Institute Committee shall consist solely of the following Governors and additional members appointed under section 61(2), that is to say:—

(a) three governors elected by the Corporation from among the governors *ex officio* under paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 2 of this scheme and elected under sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 2 of this scheme;

- (b) two governors elected by the *Senatus Academicus* of the University of Aberdeen from among the three governors elected under sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 2 of this scheme;
- (c) the governor elected under sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 2 of this scheme;
- (d) the governor elected under sub-paragraph (ix) of paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 2 of this scheme;
- (e) the governors co-opted under paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 2 of this scheme who are the persons or representatives of bodies who have been co-opted for their interest in the work of the Institute;
- (f) the Director and Deputy Director of the Institute *ex officio*;
- (g) four persons elected as follows:—
 - (i) such number of persons not exceeding three as may be decided by the Institute Committee to be elected by the Academic Council of the Institute from among the members of the full-time academic staff of the Institute who are members of the Academic Council;
 - (ii) such number of persons not exceeding three as may be decided by the Institute Committee to be elected by the full-time academic staff of the Institute from their own number in a manner to be specified by the governing body;
- (h) one person nominated by the Aberdeen Chamber of Commerce;
- (i) one person nominated by the Aberdeen Trades Council;
- (j) two persons nominated by the Secretary of State.

(3) A person shall be disqualified from being a member of the Institute Committee, other than a member *ex officio* or a member elected under paragraph (g) of subsection (2) of this section, if he is a member of the full-time academic staff of the Institute or if he is in receipt of full-time education being provided by the Institute, or if he, while pursuing a course of full-time education being provided by the Institute, is allowed leave of absence from the course for a period.

(4) For the purposes of this section the expression "Academic Council" means the body of persons appointed for the Institute in accordance with regulations 4(1) and 8(a) of the Central Institutions (Scotland) Regulations, 1972."

Condition of grant

11. It shall be a condition of the payment of any grant under section 75(c) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962 (a) to the governing body of any central institution specified in Column (1) of Schedule 1 to these regulations or to the governing body of the Robert Gordon's Institute of Technology that such governing body shall comply with the requirements imposed on them by these regulations.

Savings

12.—(1) The provision of any instrument relating to any of the central institutions specified in Column (1) of Schedule 1 to these regulations and in force immediately before the date of the coming into operation of these regulations shall, except as otherwise expressly varied or revoked by these regulations, continue in force after said date as if these regulations had not been made.

(2) Anything done under any provision of any instrument revoked by these regulations and in force immediately before the date of coming into operation of these regulations shall not be invalidated by this revocation but shall have effect as if it had been done under that instrument as varied by said regulations.

In Article 61:—</p> <p>(a) for the word "two" there shall be substituted the word "three";</p> <p>(b) for the words "nominated", "nominate" and "nomination" wherever they occur there shall be substituted the words "appointed", "appoint" or "appointment", as appropriate.</p> <p>7. In Article 62:—</p> <p>(a) the words from the beginning to "be Elected Governors" shall cease to have effect;</p> <p>(b) for the words "nominated", "nominating", "nomination" and "nominate" wherever they occur there shall be substituted the words "appointed", "appointing", "appointment" or "appoint", as appropriate.</p> <p>8. In Article 64:—</p> <p>(a) for paragraphs (d) and (e) there shall be substituted the following paragraphs:—</p> <p>"(d) If he fails to attend any meetings of the Governors or any committees for a period longer than six consecutive months otherwise than for a reason approved by the Governors.</p> <p>(e) If he has been appointed either by the Academic Council or by the full time academic staff of the College and ceases to be a member of the said Academic Council or of the said full-time academic staff as the case may be."</p> <p>9. In Article 65 for the words from "five" to "said Authority" there shall be substituted the words "one of whom shall be the person appointed by the County of Selkirk".</p> <p>10. In Article 66, the words "of whom two at least must be elected Governors" shall cease to have effect.</p>

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations apply to those central institutions, other than the Dundee Institute of Art and Technology, the governing bodies of which are grant-aided under section 75(c) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962. They prescribe—

- (a) in respect of such central institutions other than Robert Gordon's Institute of Technology,
 - (i) for each of the governing bodies to be composed of such members as are prescribed in the Regulations, for the determination of the term of office of each of the members appointed to the governing bodies and for the notification of vacancies to persons or bodies entitled to make such appointments;
 - (ii) for the circumstances in which a person is disqualified from being appointed a governor and for the circumstances in which governors shall be deemed to have resigned;
 - (iii) for the amendment of the governing instruments of each of the central institutions to the extent to which the provisions of such instruments are in the opinion of the Secretary of State inconsistent with the Regulations;
 - (iv) for each of the governing bodies to continue to exercise the necessary acts of administration relative to the central institution until the first meeting of the governing body as prescribed in the Regulations;
 - (v) for the payment to members of governing bodies of out-of-pocket expenses at the rates prescribed under the Local Government Act 1948 or sections 45(4) and 46 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973.
- (b) in respect of Robert Gordon's Institute of Technology for the appointment by the College Governors of a Standing Committee constituted of such members as are prescribed in the Regulations, for the delegation to it of the functions of the College Governors relating to the Institute and for the circumstances in which a person is disqualified from becoming a member of the Standing Committee.
