The Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Wages Council (Great Britain) (Abolition) Order 1974

23rd October 1974 Made -

Laid before Parliament 1st November 1974

Coming into Operation 1st December 1974

Whereas following a report dated the 31st July 1973 of the Commission on Industrial Relations made pursuant to section 6(2) of the Wages Councils Act 1959(a), as amended by the Industrial Relations Act 1971(b), which recommended the abolition of the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Wages Council (Great Britain), the Secretary of State has, in accordance with section 4 of, and Schedule 1 to, the said Act of 1959, published notice of his intention to make an Order abolishing the said Wages Council:

And whereas the Secretary of State has considered the objections which have been made to the draft of the said Order referred to in the said notice and is of the opinion that they were made to the said Commission on Industrial Relations and were expressly dealt with by the Commission in its report:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4(1)(b) of, and paragraph 4 of Schedule 1 to, the said Act of 1959 and now vested in him(c), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1. The Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Wages Council (Great Britain) is hereby abolished.
- 2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Wages Council (Great Britain) (Abolition) Order 1974 and shall come into operation on 1st December 1974.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order abolishes the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Wages Council (Great Britain) which was established as a Trade Board under the Trade Boards Act 1909 (c.22). The Trade Board was converted into a Wages Council by the Wages Councils Act 1945 (c.17) and was continued in existence as such by the Wages Councils Act 1959 (c.69).
