# The London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (North of Luncarty to South of Birnam) Order 1974

Made - - -

28th November 1974

Coming into Operation

28th December 1974

The Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred on him by Sections 1(2) and 2(3) of the Trunk Roads Act 1946(a) as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order 1955(b) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf and having complied with the provisions of Schedule 2 to the said Act of 1946 as amended by Section 51 of and Schedule 1 to the Roads (Scotland) Act 1970(c) hereby makes the following order:—

- 1. This order may be cited as The London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (North of Luncarty to South of Birnam) Order 1974 and shall come into operation on 28th December 1974.
- 2. The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. The length of road (hereinafter referred to as "the new road") which the Secretary of State proposes to construct along the route described in Schedule 1 to this order, shall become trunk road on the date of the coming into operation of this order.
- 4. On 16th May next after the date on which notice is given by the Secretary of State to the Tayside Regional Council that the new road is opened for the purposes of through traffic, those lengths of the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road described in Schedule 2 to this order (hereinafter referred to as "the old roads") shall cease to be trunk roads and the said Regional Council shall become the highway authority therefor.

#### SCHEDULE 1

#### THE ROUTE OF THE NEW ROAD

From a point on the existing London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (A9) 95 metres or thereby south-east of its junction with the Newmill-Letham-Tullybelton Road in a generally northerly direction for a distance of 10·65 kilometres or thereby to a point 320 metres or thereby south-east of Frankley Lodge, the centre line of the new road being indicated by a heavy black line between the points marked "A" and "F" on the plan numbered RUP/4/1/1 and marked "The London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (North of Luncarty to South of Birnam) Order 1974", signed and sealed with reference to this order and deposited at the office of the Scottish Development Department, St. Andrew's House, Edinburgh. A certified copy of the said plan has been deposited at the office of the Joint County Council of the County of Perth and Kinross, County Offices, York Place, Perth.

#### SCHEDULE 2

#### THE OLD ROADS

- 1. That length of the said existing trunk road from a point 95 metres or thereby southeast of its junction with the Newmill-Letham-Tullybelton Road in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 120 metres or thereby as shown by black and white hatching between the points marked "A" and "B" on the said plan.
- 2. That length of the said existing trunk road from a point 55 metres or thereby north of the said junction in a north-easterly then north-westerly direction for a distance of 360 metres or thereby as shown by black and white hatching between the points marked "C" and "D" on the said plan.
- 3. That length of the said existing trunk road from a point 450 metres or thereby north-west of the said junction in a generally northerly direction for a distance of 10·25 kilometres or thereby to a point 310 metres or thereby south-east of Frankley Lodge as shown by black and white hatching between the points marked "E" and "F" on the said plan.
