**The Anti-Dumping (Provisional Charge to Duty)
(Extension) Order 1974**

The Secretary of State, in exercise of powers conferred by section 8(3) of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969(a) and now vested in him (b), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Anti-Dumping (Provisional Charge to Duty) (Extension) Order 1974 and shall come into operation on 19th December 1974.

2. The Anti-Dumping (Provisional Charge to Duty) Order 1974(c) (which came into operation on 19th September 1974 and would otherwise cease to have effect at the expiration of three months beginning with that date) shall continue in force until the expiry of a period of six months beginning with that date.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order continues in force for a further three months the Anti-Dumping (Provisional Charge to Duty) Order 1974. The extended Order relates to wooden doors and panels, wholly or partly louvred, of Tariff Heading ex 44.23 B(II) originating in Taiwan and imposes on them a provisional charge in respect of an anti-dumping duty at the rate of thirty per cent.
