HARBOURS, DOCKS, PIERS AND FERRIES

The Warkworth Harbour Revision Order 1973

Made - - - 24th October 1973

Laid before Parliament 22nd January 1974

Coming into Operation 2nd April 1974

The Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964(a) and now vested in him(b) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and on the application of the Warkworth Harbour Commissioners, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Warkworth Harbour Revision Order 1973 and shall come into operation on the date fixed in accordance with the provisions of the Statutory Orders (Special Procedure) Acts 1945 and 1965(c).

(2) The Warkworth Harbour Acts 1847 to 1953 and this Order may be cited together as the Warkworth Harbour Acts and Order 1847 to 1973.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“the Act of 1893” means the Warkworth Harbour Act 1893(d);

“the Commissioners” means the Warkworth Harbour Commissioners.

Power to mortgage land

3. In addition to the powers of borrowing authorised by section 7 of the Act of 1893 the Commissioners may raise money by the mortgage of any land for the time being vested in the Commissioners:

Provided that the aggregate of the monies for the time being borrowed under the said section 7 and under this article shall not exceed £150,000.

Costs of Order

4. The costs charges and expenses of and incidental to the preparing and obtaining of this Order and otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Commissioners and may in whole or in part be defrayed out of revenue.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order authorises the Warkworth Harbour Commissioners to raise money by the mortgage of any land for the time being vested in them, limiting the total amount which may at any one time be borrowed under this power and under section 7 of the Warkworth Harbour Act 1893 to £150,000.
