**The Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972
(Commencement No. 3) Order 1975**

Made - - - - 17th July 1975

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 279 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972(a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following order:—

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972 (Commencement No. 3) Order 1975.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889 (b) shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) In this order, “the Act” means the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972.

2. The provisions of the Act specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this order (which relate to the matters specified in the column 2 thereof) shall come into operation in the whole of Scotland on 17th July 1975.

3. On the coming into operation of the provisions of the Act specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this order, sections 58(11) and 59(4) of and Schedule 11 to the Act shall cease to have effect.

PROVISIONS COMING INTO OPERATION ON 17th July 1975
