WAGES COUNCILS

The Paper Box Wages Council (Great Britain) (Abolition) Order 1975

Made - - - 16th January 1975

Laid before Parliament 27th January 1975

Coming into Operation 1st June 1975

Whereas the Secretary of State in accordance with section 4 of, and Schedule 1 to, the Wages Councils Act 1959(a) published notice of his intention to make an order abolishing the Paper Box Wages Council (Great Britain):

And whereas objections were made with respect to the draft order referred to in the said notice:

And whereas under paragraph 5(b) of the said Schedule 1, as amended by the Industrial Relations Act 1971(b), the Secretary of State referred the said draft order to the Commission on Industrial Relations for inquiry and report, and in accordance with paragraph 6 of the said Schedule 1 notified to the Commission the objections which he wished the Commission to take into account:

And whereas the said Commission on Industrial Relations made a report recommending the abolition of the said Wages Council, which report the Secretary of State has considered:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4(1)(b) of the said Act of 1959 and now vested in him(c), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1. The Paper Box Wages Council (Great Britain) is hereby abolished.
- 2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Paper Box Wages Council (Great Britain) (Abolition) Order 1975 and shall come into operation on 1st June 1975.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order abolishes the Paper Box Wages Council (Great Britain) which was established in 1910 as a Trade Board under the Trade Boards Act 1909 (c. 22). The Trade Board was converted into a Wages Council by the Wages Councils Act 1945 (c. 17) and was continued in existence as such by the Wages Councils Act 1959 (c. 69).
