TRANSPORT CHARGES

The Great Yarmouth Port and Haven (Revision of Charges) Order 1976

Made - - - - 24th March 1976 Coming into Operation 25th March 1976

The Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Transport Charges &c (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1954(a) and now vested in him(b) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1. Subject to the provisions of Article 2 of this Order the Great Yarmouth Port and Haven Commissioners may demand, take and recover in respect of such vessels as are specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order rates not exceeding those specified in Column 2 of the said Schedule in lieu of the rates which they are for the time being authorised to demand, take and recover in pursuance of section 3 of the Great Yarmouth Port and Haven Act 1963(c) and the Great Yarmouth Port and Haven (Revision of Charges) Order 1973(d).
 - 2. The rates authorised by this Order shall not be payable—
 - (i) in respect of the use of any vessel or the carriage or conveyance of any passenger on waters which form part of a harbour as defined in section 57 of the Harbours Act 1964(e), or
 - (ii) in addition to any rates of similar amount paid in respect of the same vessel, period or passenger to the said Commissioners as ship or passenger dues charged by them pursuant to the power contained in section 26 of the Harbours Act 1964.
- 3. The Interpretation Act 1889(f) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

For the purposes of this Schedule a year shall be deemed to commence on the 25th day of March and end on the next ensuing 24th day of March and the provisions in the Schedule to the said Act of 1963 applicable to the payment of the tolls specified in the Schedule shall apply to the payment of the tolls specified in paragraph 1 of this Schedule.
