**The Social Security (Claims and Payments) (Unemployment
Benefit Transitory Provisions) Amendment Regulations 1978**

The Secretary of State for Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 79(1) and (3) of the Social Security Act 1975(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, after reference to the National Insurance Advisory Committee, hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations, which may be cited as the Social Security (Claims and Payments) (Unemployment Benefit Transitory Provisions) Amendment Regulations 1978, amend the Social Security (Claims and Payments) (Unemployment Benefit Transitory Provisions) Regulations 1977(b) (hereinafter in these Regulations referred to as “the principal regulations”) and shall come into operation on 1st September 1978.

(2) The rules for the construction of Acts of Parliament contained in the Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the purposes of the interpretation of these regulations as they apply for the purposes of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Extension of period during which principal regulations in operation

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations (limited transitory provision for claims for unemployment benefit in advance) shall be amended by substituting in paragraph (1) of that regulation for the words “one year” the words “two years”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Social Security (Claims and Payments) (Unemployment Benefit Transitory Provisions) Regulations 1977 by increasing to two years the period of one year specified in those regulations during which certain claims for unemployment benefit, made at certain specified unemployment benefit offices, may be made for a period falling partly after the date on which the claim is made.

The Report of the National Insurance Advisory Committee dated 19th July 1978 on the draft of these Regulations referred to them is contained in Command Paper (Cmnd No. 7296) published by Her Majesty's Stationery Office.

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
