The Counsellors of State in Council

Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 21st day of July 1978, to delegate to the six Counsellors of State therein named or any two or more of them full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval for anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas a draft of this Order has been approved by resolution of each House of Parliament in pursuance of section 1(4) of the Ministerial and other Salaries Act 1975(a):

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, do in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section 1(4) and of all other powers enabling Her Majesty in that behalf, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, order on Her Majesty's behalf, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Citation, commencement and revocation

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Ministerial and other Salaries Order 1978.
 - (2) This Order shall come into operation on 31st July 1978.
 - (3) The Ministerial and other Salaries Order 1977(b) is hereby revoked.

Increase by 10 per cent. of Ministerial salaries

- 2.—(1) For the amount specified in subsection (2) of section 1 of the Ministerial and other Salaries Act 1975 as the aggregate amount of the salary payable to the Lord Chancellor under that subsection and the salary payable to him as Speaker of the House of Lords there shall be substituted £22,228.
- (2) For the amount, or the maximum or minimum amount, of salary specified in Parts I, II, III and IV of Schedule 1 to the Act of 1975 in relation to each of the offices specified in the first column of Schedule 1 to this Order there shall be substituted the amount, or the maximum or minimum amount, of salary specified in relation to that office in the second column of that Schedule.

Increase by 10 per cent. of salaries of Opposition Leaders and Whips

3. For the amount of salary specified in Part I of Schedule 2 to the Act of 1975 in relation to each of the positions specified in the first column of Schedule 2 to this Order there shall be substituted the amount of salary specified in relation to that position in the second column of that Schedule.

Increase by 10 per cent. of the Speaker's salary

4. For the amount specified in subsection (3) of section 1 of the Act of 1975 as the salary of the Speaker of the House of Commons there shall be substituted £14,300.

The amounts specified in Part I of Schedule 1 to this Order are the maximum salaries payable. The actual salaries in payment therefore may be below these levels.

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
