**The South Africa (United Nations Arms Embargo) (Prohibited Transactions) (Guernsey) (Amendment) Order 1978**

*Made - - - - 20th December 1978*  
*Laid before Parliament 3rd January 1979*  
*Coming into Operation 24th January 1979*

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 20th day of December 1978

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas under Article 41 of the Charter of the United Nations the Security Council of the United Nations have, by a resolution adopted on 4th November 1977, called upon Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and all other Members of the United Nations to apply certain measures to give effect to a decision of that Council in relation to the Republic of South Africa.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 1 of the United Nations Act 1946(a), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the South Africa (United Nations Arms Embargo) (Prohibited Transactions) (Guernsey) (Amendment) Order 1978, shall come into operation on 24th January 1979 and shall extend to the Bailiwick of Guernsey.

2. Article 3(3) of the South Africa (United Nations Arms Embargo) (Prohibited Transactions) (Guernsey) Order 1978(b) shall be amended by inserting at the end of the Article the following words:—

“and specialised parts and components of any of the apparatus, appliances or equipment falling within a description in that Group, whether or not such parts and components are specified in the description”.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order extends to the Bailiwick of Guernsey. It amends Article 3 of the South Africa (United Nations Arms Embargo) (Prohibited Transactions) (Guernsey) Order 1978 by including among the goods to which that Article applies (and in respect of which certain transactions connected with manufacture or maintenance in South Africa are accordingly prohibited) specialised parts and components of the apparatus, appliances and equipment in Group I of Part II of Schedule 1 to the Export of Goods (Control) Order 1978 (S.I. 1978/796 as amended by S.I. 1978/1496).
