**The Town and Country Planning (Scotland)
(Industrial Development Certificates: Exemption) Order 1978**

The Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 67 and 273 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972(a), hereby directs as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) (Industrial Development Certificates: Exemption) Order 1978 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1978.

2. The provisions of section 66(1) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972 shall have effect as if the number of square feet therein specified were 15,000.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order amends section 66(1) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972. Industrial development in Scotland will now require an industrial development certificate only if the industrial floor space to be created by the development together with the industrial floor space created by any related development exceeds 15,000 square feet.

The Order does not affect the existing exemption whereby no industrial development certificate is required in respect of any industrial development of land in the development areas of Scotland.

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
