The Fowey Port Health Authority Order 1979

Made - - - -

28th August 1979

Coming into Operation

1st October 1979

The Secretary of State for Social Services, in exercise of powers conferred by sections 2, 3 and 9(1) of the Public Health Act 1936(a), as extended by section 108 of and paragraph 6 of Schedule 3 to the Control of Pollution Act 1974(b), and now vested in him(c), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, having given the notices required by the aforesaid section 2 of his proposals to make this order and not having received any notice of objection thereto, hereby makes the following order:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Fowey Port Health Authority Order 1979 and shall come into operation on 1st October 1979.
 - (2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

"the Act" means the Public Health Act 1936:

"the Port of Fowey" and "the Port of Falmouth" means respectively the ports of those names as established for the purposes of the enactments relating to customs and excise;

"the joint board" means the joint board establishment by virtue of Article 2.

- (3) The riparian authorities specified for the purposes of this Order are Restormel Borough Council and Caradon District Council.
- (4) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, any reference to an article or a schedule shall be construed as a reference to an article contained in this order, or to a schedule thereto.

Port Health Authority

2.—(1) For the purposes of the Act, the Port of Fowey, together with that part of the Port of Falmouth which lies to the east of the boundary of the District of Carrick at Portholland (Ordnance Survey grid reference SW 9595 4107) shall be a port health district, and a joint board shall be the port health authority for that district.

- (2) The joint board shall be called the Fowey Port Health Authority and shall consist of 10 members.
- (3) The members of the joint board shall be appointed from amongst the members of their respective councils by Restormel Borough Council, which shall appoint eight members, and Caradon District Council, which shall appoint two members.

Appointment of Members to the Joint Board

- 3.—(1) The specified riparian authorities shall appoint members to the joint board at meetings to be held in May each year.
- (2) Any vacancies occurring amongst members of the joint board shall be filled by the specified riparian authority in whose representation the vacancy occurred at a meeting to be held as soon as reasonably possible after such occurrence.
- (3) Not less than seven days before a meeting of a specified riparian authority at which it is proposed to elect a member of the joint board, the proper officer of that authority shall give notice of the meeting and of the proposed appointment to every member of that authority.
- (4) The proper officer of a specified riparian authority shall forthwith notify in writing to the proper officer of the joint board the name, address and occupation of any person appointed by his authority to be a member of the joint board.
- (5) A person appointed to the joint board shall cease to be a member of the board if he ceases to be a member of the Council of the specified riparian authority by which he was appointed.

Retirement of Members

- 4.—(1) All members of the joint board shall retire from office, and the newly appointed members shall come into office on 1st June each year.
- (2) A retiring member of a joint board may be re-appointed to the board for a further term of office if at the time of his re-appointment he is otherwise qualified to be appointed.

Chairman of the Joint Board

- 5.—(1) The chairman of the joint board shall be elected annually by the members of the board from amongst the members.
- (2) The election of the chairman shall be the first business transacted at the annual meeting of the joint board.
- (3) In the case of equality of votes the person presiding at the annual meeting shall give a casting vote in addition to any other vote he may have.
- (4) The chairman shall, unless he resigns or becomes disqualified, continue in office until his successor becomes entitled to act as chairman.
- (5) During his term of office the chairman shall continue to be a member of the joint board.

Jurisdiction

- 6.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), the joint board shall have jurisdiction as port health authority over all waters within the port health district, and also over such part of the district of the specified riparian authorities as comprises the whole of any wharf and of the area within the gates of any dock and the buildings thereon respectively.
- (2) The joint board shall not have jurisdiction over any part of the district of the specified riparian authorities which falls within the jurisdiction of any other port health authority.

Functions assigned to Joint Board

- 7.—(1) There are hereby assigned to the joint board as port health authority the functions, rights and liabilities of a local authority under the enactments specified in the Schedule, so far as they are applicable to a port health authority and to any lands, waters, premises, vessels or persons within their jurisdiction.
- (2) For the purposes of the functions, rights and liabilities assigned to the joint board by virtue of this order, the enactments mentioned in the Schedule shall have effect as if
 - (a) any vessel lying within their jurisdiction were a house, building or premises, and
 - (b) the master or other officer or person in charge of the vessel were the occupier.
- (3) This article shall not apply to any vessel belonging to Her Majesty or to any vessel engaged in the service of Her Majesty, whether belonging to Her Majesty or not, or to any vessel belonging to the armed forces of any country to which the provisions of the Visiting Forces Act 1952(a) apply by virtue of section 1 of that Act.

Expenses

8. The specified riparian authorities shall contribute towards any expenses incurred or to be incurred by the joint board by virtue of the authority conferred upon them by this order in the following proportions, namely—

Restormel Borough Council

eight-tenths

Caradon District Council

two-tenths.

Audit

9. All accounts of the joint board or of any committee of the board shall be audited in accordance with the provisions of Part VIII of the Local Government Act 1972(b) by the District Auditor.

Revocation

10. The Fowey Port Sanitary (Consolidation) Order 1927(a), Article 66 of the Cornwall Review Order 1934(b), the Fowey Port Health Amendment Order 1938(c) and the entry relating to the Fowey Port Health Authority in the Schedule to the Port Health Authorities (Election and Retirement of Members) Order 1950(d) are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order constitutes the Port of Fowey, together with that part of the Port of Falmouth which lies to the east of Portholland as a port health authority and constitutes a joint board, consisting of representatives of Restormel Borough Council and Caradon District Council, to be port health authority for that district. Provision is also made for those authorities to contribute to the expenses of the joint board. This Order supersedes similar orders made under the Public Health Acts and confers upon the joint board functions under general Acts relating to public health and food and drugs.
