## The Monegasque Tonnage Order 1979

<i>Made</i> - - - -	14th March 1979
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	22nd March 1979
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	12th April 1979

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 14th day of March 1979

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 84(1) of the Merchant Shipping Act 1894(a) it is enacted that whenever it appears to Her Majesty the Queen in Council that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by any foreign country and are in force there, Her Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being re-measured in Her Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas it appears to Her Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the said Act of 1894 now in force and made by virtue of section 1 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1965(b) have been adopted by the Government of His Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco and are in force there:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by the said section 84(1), and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Monegasque Tonnage Order 1979 and shall come into operation on 12th April 1979.

2. Ships of the Principality of Monaco the tonnage of which is denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers denoting tonnage shall, without being re-measured in Her Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

3. This Order shall apply to ships of the Principality of Monaco when in the United Kingdom.

This Order provides that the tonnage shown in the certificates of registry or other national papers of Monegasque ships shall be recognised in the same way as the tonnage shown in the certificate of registry of a British ship.
