REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE

**The European Assembly Elections (Returning Officers' Expenses)
Regulations 1979**

Made - - - - 23rd May 1979
Coming into Operation 28th May 1979

The Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 20(2) of the Representation of the People Act 1949(a), as applied by Regulation 3(1) of and Schedule 1 to the European Assembly Elections Regulations 1979(b) hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the European Assembly Elections (Returning Officers' Expenses) Regulations 1979, and shall come into operation on 28th May 1979.

2. These Regulations shall not extend to Northern Ireland.

3. Unless the context otherwise requires, in these Regulations:—

“European Assembly Constituency” means a constituency of the Assembly of the European Communities for the time being specified in an Order in Council made under Schedule 2 of the European Assembly Elections Act 1978(c);

“Parliamentary Constituency” means an area having separate representation in the House of Commons;

and other expressions have the same meaning as in the Representation of the People Act 1949 and the European Assembly Elections Act 1978.

4. The maximum charges to which a returning officer at an election for the European Assembly shall be entitled are:—

(a) in respect of services rendered by him, the amounts specified in Part A of the Schedule to these Regulations; and

(b) in respect of expenses incurred by him, the amounts specified in Part B of the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE

SCALE OF MAXIMUM CHARGES IN RESPECT OF SERVICES RENDERED AND EXPENSES INCURRED BY A RETURNING OFFICER FOR THE PURPOSES OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH A EUROPEAN ASSEMBLY ELECTION.

Only the fees and disbursements specified hereunder shall be chargeable and in particular a returning officer shall not be entitled to charge as an expense payments which he makes from his fees (or otherwise) to a deputy returning officer by way of remuneration for performing functions of the returning officer.

PART A—FEES

I In a contested election:

£

1. For conducting the election and generally performing duties which a returning officer is required to perform under any enactments relating to European Assembly elections, other than any duties for which separate fees are prescribed.
For each European Assembly constituency 3,300.00

Provided that:—

- (a) where a European Assembly constituency is comprised of more than 8 Parliamentary constituencies and the total number of registered electors is less than 520,000 an additional sum of £300 in respect of each Parliamentary constituency above 8 shall be payable,
(b) where a European Assembly constituency is comprised of more than 8 Parliamentary constituencies and the total number of registered electors is more than 520,000 an additional sum of £300 for every 10,000 registered electors over 520,000 shall be paid.

2. For services in connection with the despatch and receipt of ballot papers of persons entitled to vote by post:

For each European Assembly constituency:

The sum of £20 for each Parliamentary constituency contained within the European Assembly constituency.

In addition, if the number of persons entitled to vote by post in a Parliamentary constituency exceeds 500, there shall be paid:

For every 500 or fraction thereof over 500 up to 2,000	0.65
For every 50 or fraction thereof over 2,000 ...	0.20

II In an uncontested election, for services specified in paragraph I 1. of this part of the Schedule the amount shall be one-third of the sum prescribed thereunder.

III For services in connection with the preparation, maintenance and issue of official poll cards:

For each European Assembly constituency:

- (a) For the preparation, the first revision and the issue of the poll cards on the occasion of an election, the sum of £120 for each Parliamentary constituency within the European Assembly constituency.
- (b) For each revision and preparation after the first prior to the issue of the cards the sum of £40 for each Parliamentary constituency within the European Assembly constituency.

PART B—DISBURSEMENTS

Except as expressly provided in this part of the Schedule, in no case shall a charge exceed the sum actually and necessarily paid or payable by the returning officer. Subject thereto the maximum charges shall be as follows:

I In a contested election:

1. For the presiding officer at each polling station (to include all expenses, other than any travelling and overnight subsistence expenses specified in this part of the Schedule)	24.00
In addition, a further sum, not exceeding £1.50 may be paid to one of the presiding officers at a polling place to which there are assigned not less than 3,000 voters being a presiding officer who acts as overall presiding officer at that polling place.	
2. (a) For one clerk at each polling station	18.00
(b) For additional clerks at a polling station to which there are assigned more than 700 voters such additional clerks not to exceed one clerk for every 600 voters or fraction thereof in excess of 700:	
For each additional clerk (whole-time or part-time as the case may require) an amount within a range having a maximum of	18.00
3.—(1) For the employment of persons in connection with the manual preparation and issue of the official poll cards, including charges for superannuation contributions where payable:	
(a) For the initial preparation of the cards:	
For every 100 cards or fraction thereof	1.50
(b) For each revision:	
(i) For every 100 cards or fraction thereof prepared on the initial preparation	0.25

(ii) For every 100 new cards or fraction thereof prepared	1.50
<p>Provided that, if the number of new cards does not exceed 15 per cent. of the number prepared on the initial preparation, the total allowance, for the revision shall be increased by 5 per cent.</p>	
(c) For the revision of a particular section of the cards (other than such a revision carried out in the course of a revision of the whole):	
For every 100 new cards or fraction thereof prepared	1.50
(d) For the completion and issue of the cards on the occasion of an election:	
For every 100 cards or fraction thereof issued (or withdrawn in respect of voters entitled to vote by post)	0.75
(2) For the employment of persons in connection with the issue of poll cards which have not been prepared manually, including charges for superannuation contributions where payable:	
For every 100 cards or fraction thereof	0.75
<p>Provided that the maximum amount which a returning officer shall be entitled to charge under this paragraph shall be the total of the sums which he would be entitled to charge for such of the stages of work represented by items (1)(a), (b), (c) and (d) and (2) hereunder as he has carried out, notwithstanding that the amount disbursed by him for any particular stage is greater than the amount specified hereunder as the maximum amount for that stage; provided also that the maximum amount which a returning officer shall be entitled to charge under this paragraph shall be increased by any amount by which the maximum amount which he is entitled to charge under paragraph 4 below exceeds the amount disbursed by him for the purposes described in that paragraph.</p>	
<p>4. For the employment of persons in connection with the verification and count and the ballot papers of electors entitled to vote by post, and for all clerical and other assistance employed by the returning officer, deputy returning officer, acting returning officer or deputy acting returning officer for the purposes of the election, including charges for superannuation contributions where payable:</p>	
(a) For each European Assembly constituency	10,000.00
(b) Supplement for counting ballot papers on Sunday 10th June 1979	1,750.00
(c) For every 100 persons or fraction thereof entitled to vote by post	13.80

	£
(d) In the event of a recount of the votes being ordered in a European Assembly constituency:	
For each recount	1,000.00
<p>Provided that the maximum amount which a returning officer shall be entitled to charge under this paragraph shall be increased by any amount by which the maximum amount which he is entitled to charge under paragraph 3 above exceeds the amount disbursed by him for the purposes described in that paragraph.</p>	
5. Returning officer's, deputy returning officer's, acting returning officer's or deputy acting returning officer's travelling and overnight subsistence expenses where necessary to make arrangements for the poll or otherwise in connection with the conduct of the election	Actual and necessary cost.
6. Travelling and overnight subsistence expenses of presiding officers and poll clerks (including any expenses incurred in conveying the ballot boxes in those cases in which presiding officers or poll clerks are responsible for the transport of the boxes to or from the polling stations) ...	Actual and necessary cost.
7. Travelling and overnight subsistence expenses of clerical and other assistants employed by the returning officer, deputy returning officer, acting returning officer or deputy acting returning officer where necessary to make arrangements for the poll or otherwise in connection with the conduct of the election	Actual and necessary cost.
8. For printing and providing ballot papers	Actual and necessary cost.
9. For printing and providing official poll cards	Actual and necessary cost.
10. For printing and providing notices and other documents required in and about the election or poll and costs of publishing the same	Actual and necessary cost.
11. For the renting of any building or room for the purpose of the election and for expenses of heating, lighting and cleaning any building or room for such purpose	Actual and necessary cost.
12. For adapting and fitting up any building or room for the purpose of the election (including the provision of voting compartments and any necessary furniture) and restoring it to fit condition for its normal use	Actual and necessary cost.

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13. For providing ballot boxes, including any repairs ...	Actual and necessary cost.
14. For the conveyance of ballot boxes and ballot papers in those cases where the cost of transport is not included in the travelling expenses of presiding officers and poll clerks under paragraph I. 6 of this part of the Schedule	Actual and necessary cost.
15. For every stamping instrument required to be purchased, hired, altered or repaired	Actual and necessary cost.
16. For copies of the electoral register	Actual and necessary cost.
17. For general stationery, postage, telegrams, telephone calls, bank charges and miscellaneous expenses	Actual and necessary cost.

II In an uncontested election, for all necessary preliminary work the amount shall be the same as the amount specified for corresponding work in a contested election, except that for all clerical and other assistance employed by the returning officer, deputy returning officer, acting returning officer or deputy acting returning officer for the purposes of the election, including charges for superannuation contributions where payable, the amount shall not be more than one-quarter of the amount specified under paragraph I. 4 of this part of the Schedule.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations prescribe for England, Scotland and Wales the maximum charges in respect of services rendered and expenses incurred by the returning officers for the purpose of or in connection with the European Assembly Elections.

Provision has also been made in the Regulations for the payment of a special fee for the work on the counting of ballot papers which is to take place on Sunday 10th June 1979.

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
