(b) in the parish of St. Mary's, the functions so conferred or imposed by—

section 164 of the said Act, section 44 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1890, sections 76 and 77 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907, Part VI of the Public Health Act 1925 and sections 52 to 54 of the Public Health Act 1961;

section 165 of the Public Health Act 1875 and section 46 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1890;

(c) the functions conferred or imposed on county councils—

by the War Memorials (Local Authorities' Powers) Act 1923;

by the Diseases of Animals Act 1950;

- (d) the functions conferred or imposed in England on county councils by sections 74(2) and 76(1) of the Public Health Act 1936 and paragraph 5 of Schedule 14 to the Local Government Act 1972; and
- (e) the functions conferred or imposed on local authorities by—

the Explosives Act 1875;
