SEA FISHERIES

**The Third Country Fishing (Enforcement) (No. 2)
Regulations 1980**

Made - - - - - 7th August 1980

Laid before Parliament 15th August 1980

Coming into Operation 5th September 1980

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State^(a) acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972^(b) and of all their other enabling powers, hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Third Country Fishing (Enforcement) (No. 2) Regulations 1980 and shall come into operation on 5th September 1980.

(2) In these regulations, “relevant community provision” means any provision of a regulation of the European Communities referred to in column 1 of the Schedule to these regulations which is set out in column 3 of that Schedule opposite the reference to that regulation.

Offences and penalties

2. If there is, in respect of any vessel to which a relevant community provision applies, a contravention of, or failure to comply with, that provision within British fishery limits, the master of that vessel shall be guilty of an offence, and liable—

(a) on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £1,000; or

(b) on conviction on indictment to a fine.

Enforcement

3.—(1) The provisions of section 8(2) to (4) of the Sea Fisheries Act 1968^(c) (general powers of British sea-fishery officers) shall have effect in relation to these regulations as they have effect in relation to an order made under section 5 of that Act or section 2 of the Fishery Limits Act 1976^(d), and for the purpose of the enforcement of these regulations, there are hereby conferred on every British sea-fishery officer all the powers of a British sea-fishery officer under those subsections.

(2) A British sea-fishery officer shall not be liable in any civil or criminal proceedings for anything done in purported exercise of the powers conferred on him by paragraph (1) above if the court is satisfied that the act was done in good faith and that there were reasonable grounds for doing it.

(3) Any person who on any fishing boat flying the flag of Norway, Sweden or Spain, or any fishing boat registered in the Faroe Islands, which is within British fishery limits—

- (a) fails to comply with any requirement imposed, or to answer any question asked, by a British sea-fishery officer under the powers conferred on him by paragraph (1) above;
- (b) prevents, or attempts to prevent, any other person from complying with any such requirement or answering any such question; or
- (c) assaults any such officer while exercising any of the powers conferred on him by that paragraph or obstructs any such officer in the exercise of any of those powers;

shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on summary conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding £400.

Jurisdiction to try offences

4. Proceedings for an offence under the foregoing provisions of these regulations may be taken, and the offence may for all incidental purposes be treated as having been committed, in any place in the United Kingdom.

Duration of regulations

5. The provisions of these regulations shall cease to have effect on 31st December 1980.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations, which are made under section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972, make breaches of certain Community regulations relating to third country fishing offences for the purposes of United Kingdom law where they occur within British fishery limits. They will cease to have effect on 31st December 1980.

The Community regulations in question authorise fishing in certain specified areas within member states' waters for specified descriptions of fish by vessels flying the flags of Norway, Sweden and Spain, and by vessels registered in the Faroe Islands.

The offences arise out of breaches of the provisions of the Community regulations concerning the keeping of log books, radio reports and similar matters, and are all triable summarily or on indictment. On summary conviction the master of an offending vessel will be liable to a fine not exceeding £1,000 and, on conviction on indictment, to a fine.
