The Criminal Law Act 1977 (Commencement No. 7) Order 1980

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 65(7) of the Criminal Law Act 1977(a), I hereby make the following Order:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Criminal Law Act 1977 (Commencement No. 7) Order 1980.
- (2) In the case of any provision specified in the Schedule to this Order which (by virtue of sections 63(2) and 65(10) of the Criminal Law Act 1977) extends to Scotland nothing in this Order shall bring the provision into force in its application to Scotland.
- 2. The provisions of the Criminal Law Act 1977 specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order (which relate to the matters specified in column 2 thereof) shall come into force on 12th May 1980.
