**The London-South Wales Motorway (M4) (Coryton, Cardiff)  
(Speed Limit) Regulations 1980**

*Made* . . . . . 7th May 1980

*Laid before Parliament* 28th May 1980

*Coming into Operation* 8th August 1980

The Secretary of State for Wales in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 13 of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1967(a) and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with representative organisations in accordance with the provisions of section 107(2) of the said Act of 1967 hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 8th day of August 1980 and may be cited as the London-South Wales Motorway (M4) (Coryton, Cardiff) (Speed Limit) Regulations 1980.

2. In these Regulations:—

“exit slip road” means those lengths of the London-South Wales Motorway (M4) at the Coryton Interchange, Cardiff in the County of South Glamorgan which connect the main carriageway of the said motorway with the Cardiff-Glan Conwy Trunk Road (A470) and which provide exits for traffic leaving the main carriageway.

“main carriageway” means those parts of the London-South Wales Motorway (M4) used primarily by through traffic.

3. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on those lengths of exit slip road specified in the Schedule to these Regulations.

## SCHEDULE

1. That length of the eastbound exit slip road which extends from its junction with the Cardiff-Glan Conwy Trunk Road (A470) in a westerly direction for a distance of 196 metres.

2. That length of the westbound exit slip road which extends from its junction with the Cardiff-Glan Conwy Trunk Road (A470) in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 300 metres.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)*

These Regulations impose a maximum speed limit of 40 miles per hour on parts of the eastbound and westbound exit slip roads of the London-South Wales M4 Motorway at the Coryton Interchange, Cardiff in the County of South Glamorgan.
