The Public Service Vehicles (Conduct of Drivers, Conductors and Passengers) (Amendment) Regulations 1980

Laid before Parliament	9th July 1980

The Minister of Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 160(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1960(a) and now vested in him(b), and of all other enabling powers, and after consulting with representative organisations in accordance with section 260(2) of the said Act(c), hereby makes the following Regulations:-

- 1. These Regulations shall come into operation on 31st July 1980 and may be cited as the Public Service Vehicles (Conduct of Drivers, Conductors and Passengers) (Amendment) Regulations 1980.
- 2. The Public Service Vehicles (Conduct of Drivers, Conductors and Passengers) Regulations 1936(d) shall be amended so that:-
 - (1) in Regulation 2, in the definition of "conductor", for the word "licensed" there shall be substituted the word "employed"; and
 - (2) in Regulation 4, for sub-paragraph (e), there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:-
 - "(e) shall, if requested by any police constable or other person having reasonable cause, give particulars of his name, and the name and address of the person by whom he is employed and, in the case of a driver, of his licence;".
