POLICE

The Police (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 1982

Made 20th October 1982 Laid before Parliament 28th October 1982 Coming into Operation 1st December 1982

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 33 of the Police Act 1964(a) and after furnishing the Police Negotiating Board for the United Kingdom with a draft of the Regulations in accordance with section 2(1) of the Police Negotiating Board Act 1980(b), I hereby make the following Regulations:-

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 1982.
- 2. These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st December 1982 and shall have effect for the purposes of Regulations 4, 5, 7, 8, 9 and 11 as from 1st April 1982, for the purposes of Regulation 10 as from 26th April 1982, and for the purposes of Regulations 12 and 13 as from 1st September 1982.
- 3. In these Regulations any reference to the principal Regulations is a reference to the Police Regulations 1979(c).
- 4. In Regulation 26(6) of the principal Regulations for the words "a day's pay" means a week's pay divided by 5" there shall be substituted the words " pay" means a week's pay divided by 5" there shall be substituted the words "a day's pay" means the member's pay for the week in question divided by 5".
- 5. In Regulation 27 of the principal Regulations for sub-paragraph 6(b)there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:—
 - "(b) "a day's pay" means a week's pay at the rate at which the member was paid on the day in question divided by 5;".

- 6. In Regulation 32(1) of the principal Regulations for sub-paragraph (a) of the proviso there shall be substituted the following:—
 - "(a) with the consent of the police authority, a member may be so absent without such certificate of unfitness where the period of unfitness for duty does not exceed 7 days, including any day on which, even if he were fit to do so, he would not have been required to perform police duty;".
- 7. In Regulation 35(2) of the principal Regulations after sub-paragraph (b) there shall be inserted the following sub-paragraph:—
 - "(bb) no account shall be taken of any performance of the duties of that rank in respect of which a temporary salary is payable under Regulation 35A;".
- 8. After Regulation 35 of the principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following Regulation:—

"Temporary salary

- 35A.—(1) A member of a police force of the rank of superintendent who is required for a continuous period exceeding 7 days to perform duties normally performed by a member of the force of a higher rank than his own, otherwise (subject to paragraph (2)) than as the direct or indirect result of the absence of any member of the force on a monthly or other leave day granted under Regulation 28, shall be paid in respect of that period, other than the first 7 days thereof, at a rate equal to the lowest rate of pay for that higher rank.
- (2) Where any member of the force is absent for a continuous period comprising both—
 - (a) monthly or other leave days granted under Regulation 28, and
 - (b) one or more annual leave days granted under Regulation 31,
- paragraph (1) shall have effect as if the entire continuous period of absence were a period of annual leave.
- (3) A member of a police force below the rank of superintendent who, in any year, has been required to perform duties normally performed by a member of the force of a higher rank than his own for 14 complete days shall be paid in respect of each further complete day in that year on which he is required to perform such duties at a rate equal to the lowest rate of pay to which he would be entitled on promotion to the higher rank:

Provided that where a member is entitled to be paid under this paragraph and the higher rank is that of superintendent or above there shall be no entitlement to an allowance, or time off, under Regulation 26 or 27 in respect of such duties; but where in such a case the member is required to do duty on a public holiday or rostered rest day, he shall be granted a day's leave for each such day.

- (4) For the purposes of this Regulation the expression "year" means a period of 12 months beginning on 1st April.
- (5) For the purposes of this Regulation, the expression "day" means, in relation to a member of a police force below the rank of superintendent, his normal daily period of duty.".

- 9. In Regulation 36 of the principal Regulations the words "other than an allowance under Regulation 65" shall be omitted.
- 10. In Regulation 51(1)(d) of the principal Regulations, after the words "following the move", there shall be inserted the words "and may, if they think fit, reimburse him such payments in respect of a further period not exceeding 13 weeks", and for the words "that period" there shall be substituted the words "the period in question".
 - 11. Regulation 65 of the principal Regulations shall be omitted.
- 12. In Schedule 5 to the principal Regulations for Tables A and B there shall be substituted respectively the Tables set out in the Appendix to these Regulations.
- 13. In paragraph 1 of Schedule 11 to the principal Regulations (dog handler's allowance) there shall be substituted, in sub-paragraph (1)(a), for the words "£393" the words "£432", and, in sub-paragraph (1)(b), for the words "£581" the words "£585".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Police Regulations 1979.

Regulation 6 entitles a member of a police force to uncertificated sick leave for a period not exceeding 7 days.

Regulation 8 makes provision for the payment of a higher temporary salary where a member of a police force is required to perform the duties of a member of a higher rank. Regulations 4, 5, 7, 9 and 11 make consequential amendments to the 1979 Regulations.

Regulation 10 enables a police authority, where an officer moves home, to continue to reimburse any payments in connection with his former home payable after removal for a further period of 13 weeks after the expiry of the period of 13 weeks at present provided for by the 1979 Regulations.

Regulations 12 and 13 provide for increases of pay and of the dog-handler's allowance.

The Regulations come into operation on 1st December 1982 and have effect for the purposes of Regulations 4, 5, 7, 8, 9 and 11 as from 1st April 1982, for the purposes of Regulation 10 as from 26th April 1982, and for the purposes of Regulations 12 and 13 as from 1st September 1982 (retrospection is authorised by section 33(4) of the Police Act 1964).
