The Anguilla Consequential Provisions Order 1983

Present,
The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas Anguilla ceased to form part of the territory of the associated state of St. Christopher, Nevis and Anguilla on 19th December 1980, when section 1(1) of the Anguilla Act 1980(a) came into force:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers conferred upon Her by sections 13(2) and 15 of the West Indies Act 1967(b) and section 1(1) of the Anguilla Act 1980, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- Citation and commencement.
Supreme Court.
1. This Order may be cited as the Anguilla Consequential Provisions Order 1983 and shall come into operation on 1st September 1983.
 - 2.—(1) Section 6(2) of the West Indies Act 1967 shall have effect as if the word 'Anguilla,' were inserted before the word 'Montserrat'.
 - (2) The West Indies Associated States Supreme Court Order 1967(c) shall, so far as it has effect as part of the law of Anguilla, have effect as if it had been made under section 6(2) of the West Indies Act 1967, as amended by the preceding paragraph.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order modifies section 6(2) of the West Indies Act 1967 (which relates to the Supreme Court originally established as a common court for the West Indies Associated States and retained by five States upon their independence as the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court) in relation to Anguilla consequent upon its separation from St. Christopher and Nevis.
