## The Non-Contentious Probate Fees (Amendment) Order 1983

<i>Made - - - -</i>	26th July 1983
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	4th August 1983
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	1st September 1983

The Lord Chancellor, in exercise of the power conferred on him by section 130 of the Supreme Court Act 1981(a), and with the concurrence of the Lord Chief Justice, the Master of the Rolls, the President of the Family Division, The Vice-Chancellor and the Treasury, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Non-Contentious Probate Fees (Amendment) Order 1983 and shall come into operation on 1st September 1983.
2. For paragraph 1(a) of the schedule to the Non-Contentious Probate Fees Order 1981(b) there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:—

“(a) if the assessed value

does not exceed £10,000 . . . . .	No fee
exceeds £10,000 but does not exceed £25,000 ..	40.00
exceeds £25,000 but does not exceed £40,000 ..	80.00
exceeds £40,000 but does not exceed £100,000 ..	2.50 per
	£1,000 or part
	thereof”
