The Crown Office Fees Order 1983

Made - - - 30th November 1983

Coming into Operation 1st May 1984

The Lord Chancellor, in exercise of the power conferred on him by section 9 of the Great Seal (Offices) Act 1874(a), and with the concurrence of the Treasury, hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Crown Office Fees Order 1983 and shall come into operation on 1st May 1984.

Fees to be taken

2. The following fees shall be taken in the Office of the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order replaces the existing Fees Order (S.R. & O. 1938/1222, as amended by S.R. & O. 1946/617 and S.I. 1977/1971) with a new Order which makes increases in the fees for which it provides. On the other hand, provision is no longer made for fees in respect of Letters Patent for a licence for conveyance of land in the Channel Islands, a grant of separate Quarter Sessions, a licence to hold a market and a licence in mortmain, all of which are now obsolete.
