**The Control of Pollution (Consents for Discharges)
(Notices) Regulations 1984**

The Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 36(1)(a) and 104(1)(a) of the Control of Pollution Act 1974(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Control of Pollution (Consents for Discharges) (Notices) Regulations 1984, and shall come into operation on 26th July 1984.

2. Notice of an application for consent in pursuance of section 34 of the said Act for discharges of effluent or other matter, and notice of an instrument of consent served in pursuance of subsection (3) of that section, shall be in the forms respectively prescribed in the Schedule hereto, or in forms substantially to the like effect.

(g) Insert address of premises from which the discharge will be made.

(h) Insert address of office of Water Authority (or, in Scotland, River Purification Authority).

(i) Insert the date six weeks after the date on which the notice is published in the London Gazette (or, in Scotland, the Edinburgh Gazette—see section 106(8) of the Act).

(j) Insert a reference number or letter.

(k) Insert the address of a place within the locality of the proposed point of discharge.
