**1985 No. 1733 (S.132)****POLICE****The Police (Scotland) Amendment (No. 3) Regulations 1985**

<i>Made</i> - - - - -	<i>7th November 1985</i>

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 26 of the Police (Scotland) Act 1967(a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, and after taking into consideration the recommendations made by the Police Negotiating Board for the United Kingdom and furnishing the said Board with a draft of the regulations in accordance with section 2(1) of the Police Negotiating Board Act 1980(b), I hereby make the following regulations:—

*Citation*

1. These regulations may be cited as the Police (Scotland) Amendment (No. 3) Regulations 1985.

*Interpretation*

2. In these regulations any reference to the principal regulations is a reference to the Police (Scotland) Regulations 1976(c).

*Operation and Effect*

3. These regulations shall come into operation on 19th December 1985 and shall have effect, for the purposes of regulations 6 and 8, and regulation 9 so far as revoking regulations 5 and 6 of the Police (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1984(d), as from 1st September 1985.

*Amendments*

4. Regulation 25 of the principal regulations (Public holidays and monthly leave days for higher ranks) shall be amended as follows:—

- (a) in paragraph (3), for the words “3 months” there shall be substituted the words “12 months in the case of a superintendent or 3 months in any other case”; and
- (b) in paragraph (4), for the words “three months” there shall be substituted the words “12 months”.

5. In regulation 47(1)(d) of the principal regulations (Removal allowance), after the words "following the move" there shall be inserted the words "and may, if they think fit, reimburse him such payments in respect of a further period not exceeding 13 weeks", and for the words "that period" there shall be substituted the words "the period in question".

6. In Schedule 3 to the principal regulations (Scales of pay) for Tables A and B there shall be substituted, respectively, Tables A and B set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

7. In Schedule 5 to the principal regulations (Motor Vehicle Allowances in respect of Motor Cars)—

(a) in paragraph 1(1) for the definition of "year" there shall be substituted the following:—

" "year" means a twelve month period starting on a day to be determined by the police authority;" and

(b) in paragraph 5(1) the words ", unless the specified date is 1st May," shall be deleted.

8. In paragraph (1) of Schedule 10 to the principal regulations (Dog handler's allowance), for the sums "£492" and "£666" there shall be substituted respectively the sums "£528" and "£717".

#### *Revocations*

9. Regulations 5 and 6 of the Police (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1984 (relating respectively to scales of pay and to dog handler's allowance) and regulation 4 of the Police (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1980<sup>(a)</sup> (relating to public holidays and monthly leave days for higher ranks) are hereby revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)*

These regulations further amend the Police (Scotland) Regulations 1976 ("the principal regulations"). They come into operation on 19th December 1985 and have effect for the purposes of regulations 6 and 8, and regulation 9 so far as making revocations consequential on regulations 6 and 8, as from 1st September 1985 (retrospection is authorised by section 26(3) of the Police (Scotland) Act 1967).

Regulation 4 extends the period within which chief superintendents and superintendents who are required to do duty on a public holiday or are prevented from taking their full allowance of monthly leave days may be granted days in lieu or additional monthly leave days, as the case may be, from 3 months to 12 months.

Regulation 5 enables a police authority, where an officer moves his home, to continue to reimburse any payments in connection with his former home payable after removal for a further period of 13 weeks after the expiry of the period of 13 weeks at present provided for by the 1976 Regulations.

Regulation 6 increases the rate of pay for police constables up to and including the rank of chief inspector.

Regulation 7 amends, for the purpose of calculating motor vehicle allowance, the definition of a year, so as to enable a police authority to determine at what date a year begins for this purpose.

Regulation 8 increases the amount of dog handler's allowance, for officers of the rank of constable, from £492 to £528 and, for officers of other ranks, from £666 to £717.
