PLANT BREEDERS' RIGHTS

The Plant Breeders' Rights (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 1986

Made -24th February 1986 Laid before Parliament 6th March 1986 Coming into Operation 1st April 1986

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Secretary of State for Scotland, the Secretary of State for Wales and the Secretary of State for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 9(1) and 36 of the Plant Varieties and Seeds Act 1964(a) as extended to Northern Ireland (b) and now vested in them (c), and the said Minister and the Secretary of State, acting jointly, in exercise of the said powers as extended to the Isle of Man(d), with the approval of the Treasury in accordance with section 9(1) of the said Act, and in exercise of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following regulations:-

Title and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Plant Breeders' Rights (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 1986 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1986.

Amendment of principal regulations

2. For Schedule 2 to the Plant Breeders' Rights (Fees) Regulations 1985 (e) there shall be substituted the provisions set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Plant Breeders' Rights (Fees) Regulations 1985 by substituting a new Schedule for Schedule 2 to those Regulations (Regulation 2). The new Schedule prescribes an overall increase of fees for the matters for which fees were previously charged with the exception of those fees of £6.00 or less which remain at their former levels.
