The Ionising Radiations (Fees for Approvals) Regulations 1986

Made - - - - 8th April 1986

Laid before Parliament 14th April 1986

Coming into Operation 6th May 1986

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 43(2), (4), (5) and (6) of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974(a) ("the 1974 Act") and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf and for the purpose of giving effect without modifications to proposals submitted to him by the Health and Safety Commission under section 11(2)(d) of the 1974 Act, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Ionising Radiations (Fees for Approvals) Regulations 1986 and shall come into operation on 6th May 1986.
- (2) In these Regulations, "the principal Regulations" means the Ionising Radiations Regulations 1985(b).

Fees for approval of dosimetry services

- 2.—(1) A fee shall be payable to the Health and Safety Executive on application being made to the Executive for an approval and for the annual reassessment of an approval previously granted in either case under Regulation 15 of the principal Regulations.
- (2) The fee for approval of a service described in the Schedule in column 1 shall be that specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 and for annual reassessment of such approval that specified in column 3 of the Schedule.

Fees for type approval of radiation generators or apparatus containing radioactive substances

3.—(1) A fee of £60 shall be payable to the Health and Safety Executive on application being made to the Executive for the type approval of a radiation generator or an apparatus containing a radioactive substance under subparagraph (f) or (g) respectively of Schedule 3 to the principal Regulations (which excepts such type approved radiation generators or apparatus containing radioactive substances from the notification requirements of Regulation 5 of the principal Regulations).

(2) In this Regulation, "approval" includes the amendment of an approval and "amendment of an approval" includes the issue of a new approval incorporating the amendment.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations provide for the fixing and determination of fees to be payable to the Health and Safety Executive in respect of approvals of dosimetry services and type approvals of radiation generators or apparatus containing radioactive substances under the Ionising Radiations Regulations 1985 (S.I. No. 1333).

As respects the approval of dosimetry services the amount of the fee varies according to the nature of the services sought to be approved and a lesser fee is payable for the annual assessment of a service already approved. These fees are set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.

As respects the approval of radiation generators or apparatus containing radioactive substances a fixed fee of £60 is payable.
