The Matrimonial Causes Fees (Amendment) Order 1986

Made -10th April 1986 5th May 1986 Coming into Force

The Lord Chancellor, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 51 of the Matrimonial Causes Act 1973 (a) and with the concurrence of the Treasury, hereby makes the following Order:-

- This Order may be cited as the Matrimonial Causes Fees (Amendment) Order 1986 and shall come into force on 5th May 1986.
- 2. Schedule 1 to the Matrimonial Causes Fees Order 1980(b) shall be amended as follows:-
 - (1) In Fee 2 for the figure "£12" there shall be substituted the figure "£15".
 - (2) After Fee 2 there shall be inserted the following fees:—
 - "2A. Applications concerning Children On an application for an order relating to the custody or education, access, committal to care of, or provision of supervision for, a child, except where the application is for an order by consent

2B. Other Applications in Proceedings

On any application in matrimonial proceedings, except where it is otherwise provided in this Schedule, or is for an order by consent,

(i) to a Registrar £10 (ii) to a Judge

2C. Appeal from a Registrar On filing a notice of appeal from a Registrar to a Judge

(3) In Fee 3 after the words "Divorce Registry" there shall be inserted the following:-

"for any specified period of ten calendar years, or if no such period is specified, for the ten most recent years and providing a certificate of decree absolute, where appropriate

- (4) For Fee 4 there shall be substituted the following:—
 - "4. Copies of Documents
 - (i) Personal Applications

For a copy of any document, whether or not issued as an office copy, per page-
