1. These Regulations may be cited as the Blood Tests (Evidence of Paternity) (Amendment) Regulations 1987 and shall come into force on 17th August 1987.

2. For Schedule 2 to the Blood Tests (Evidence of Paternity) Regulations 1971(b) there shall be substituted the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.

3. The Blood Tests (Evidence of Paternity) (Amendment) Regulations 1986(c) are hereby revoked.
