The Registration of Births, Deaths
and Marriages (Fees) Order 1987

The Secretary of State for Social Services in exercise of the powers conferred by section 5(1) and (2) of, and paragraphs 1 and 2 of Schedule 3 to, the Public Expenditure and Receipts Act 1968⁽¹⁾ and now vested in him⁽²⁾ and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Registration of Births, Deaths and Marriages (Fees) Order 1987 and shall come into force on 1st April 1987.

Fees payable

2. The fees payable under each of the enactments specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order in respect of the matters specified in column 3 shall be the fees specified in relation thereto in column 4 and each of those enactments shall have effect accordingly.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order increases certain of the fees payable under the Acts relating to the registration of births, deaths and marriages and associated matters and it consolidates the provisions for the new fees with the provisions of the Births, Deaths and Marriages (Fees) Order 1985 relating to those which are not changed. It also revokes that Order. The fees increased relate only to marriages.

The increases take effect on 1st April 1987 and the fees payable both before and from that date are set out in the Schedule.
