The Sheriff Court Fees Amendment Order 1988

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Courts of Law Fees (Scotland) Act 1895((1)), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and with the concurrence of the Treasury, hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Sheriff Court Fees Amendment Order 1988 and shall come into force on 1st July 1988.

2. Article 7 of the Sheriff Court Fees Order 1985((2)) shall be amended by substituting, for paragraphs (a) to (c), the following:—

“(a) income support or family credit under Part II of the Social Security Act 1986((3)); or (b) advice and assistance from a solicitor under the Legal Aid (Scotland) Act 1986((4)) in respect of the simplified divorce application.”.
