The Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) Amendment No. 3 Order 1989

Partial revocation and amendment

4. In article 6, for paragraph (2) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(2) Paragraph (1) above shall not apply in the case of—

- (a) any sheep which was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given under section 2(1) of the said Act which consent did not require that the sheep to which it applies should be marked;
- (b) any sheep which was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given on or before 2nd October 1988 under section 2(1) of the said Act which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with a green mark;
- (c) any sheep which was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given on or before 8th January 1989 under section 2(1) of the said Act which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with a blue mark;
- (d) any sheep which was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given on or before 30th July 1989 under section 2(1) of the said Act which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with an apricot mark.
- (e) any sheep which—
 - (i) was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given under section 2(1) of the said Act which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with a red mark, or
 - (ii) was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given on or after 31st July 1989 under section 2(1) of the said Act which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with a green mark,
 - (iii) was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given on or after 2nd October 1989 under section 2(1) of the said Act which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with a blue mark, and which in any case has been examined and marked with an ear-tag by a person authorised in that behalf by one of the Ministers.”
