PILOTAGE

The Macduff (Pilotage Powers) Order 1989

Made - - - 2nd October 1989

Laid before Parliament 11th October 1989

Coming into force 1st November 1989

Whereas the Grampian Regional Council is a harbour authority within the meaning of the Pilotage Act 1987(a) but is not a competent harbour authority within the meaning of that Act in respect of the harbour of Macduff, and whereas it wishes to be treated for the purposes of the Act as such an authority, now therefore the Secretary of State for Transport on the application of the Grampian Regional Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 1(4) of the Pilotage Act 1987, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Macduff (Pilotage Powers) Order 1989, and shall come into force on 1st November 1989.

Interpretation

2. In this Order "the Council" means the Grampian Regional Council and "the harbour of Macduff" means the Macduff Harbour Area as defined in Schedule 1 of the Grampian Regional Council (Harbours) Order 1987 confirmed by the Grampian Regional Council (Harbours) Order Confirmation Act 1987 (b).

Application of Pilotage Act 1987

3. The Council shall be a competent harbour authority in respect of the harbour of Macduff for the purposes of the Pilotage Act 1987.
