**The Wells and Walsingham Light
Railway (Amendment) Order 1994**

Made - - - - *3rd February 1994*

Coming into force - - *4th February 1994*

The Secretary of State for Transport, on the application of Lt. Commander Roy Wallace Francis R.N. Rtd and Marie Eleanor Francis, and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 24 of the Light Railway Act 1896(1) and now vested in him(2), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Wells and Walsingham Light Railway (Amendment) Order 1994 and shall come into force on 4th February 1994.

(2) This Order and the Wells and Walsingham Light Railway Order 1982(3) may be cited together as the Wells and Walsingham Light Railway Orders 1982 and 1992.

Amendment of 1982 Order

2. For the definition of “the proprietors” in the Wells and Walsingham Light Railway Order 1982 there shall be substituted the following definition —

““the proprietors” means—

- (a) Lt. Commander Roy Wallace Francis R.N. Rtd, of Hannay, Forncett St. Mary, Norwich, Norfolk; and
- (b) Mrs. Marie Eleanor Francis, of the same address; and
- (c) Dr. Rowan Nigel Francis of Kingsmuir, Low Road, Forncett St. Mary, Norwich, Norfolk; and
- (d) Mrs. Susan Hannay Rohde of 14 Farm Road, Warlingham, Surrey;
